YOUR VOICE MATTERS

"My vote doesn't matter" and "Nothing changes as a result of surveys" are common sentiments, but surveys, voting, and feedback are powerful tools that directly influences policies, performance, governance, and the future of your community. Your input is essential for transforming your beliefs into reality.

Using your chain of command is the best way to bring about change by sharing your suggestions and opinions to make the Air and Space Force better. Another tool is surveys. They can shape the force. The Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey influences policy changes affecting our civilian force yet Air Combat Command's response rate for 2023 was 22%. Data from the Living Pattern Survey* is collected every three years to help determine cost of living allowances but the response rate in 2021 was only 6%. Low participation rates are frequently attributed to survey fatigue, time constraints, and skepticism that the results will be used to effect changes.

Providing your opinion in surveys is a way for you to have an impact on decisions that directly affect your life and issues you believe in. Participating in the data collection process is a way to shape your local community, the broader well-being of society and our government. It is a valuable mechanism for inclusive expression of thought. When combined with others, individuals create a "collective voice" and contribute to the overall outcome.

Voting is the cornerstone of our democratic legacy. About two-thirds of military members were registered to vote in 2020. Only 47% of those registered military voters voted in the last Presidential Election. In total, about 66% of the American voting-eligible population voted. Do your civic duty, remain engaged – use your voice and vote.

Constructive meaningful feedback is essential for growth. An open dialogue with active listening and honest reflection can help reinforce positive habits and encourage change of bad habits. It can enable teams to make performance adjustments for a competitive edge. Effective feedback will improve leader development and ultimately improve unit performance and mission success.

We live in a democratic society where every voice matters and can make a difference. Whether through participation in surveys, exercising your right to vote, providing feedback, or reflecting on feedback - you have the opportunity to actively shape both your own future and the world around you. Your voice matters!



- 3. This election season has the potential of being controversial with voters taking sides, often vocally and at work.


